Helping the homeless through the festive season

The coldest months are the hardest for those sleeping rough on our streets. Every year in Leytonstone a local voluntary group chaired by Rev David Britten has been working tirelessly to provide beds and essential services to the most vulnerable

'Tis the season to give. And what better way to give back to the community than to volunteer or donate to a local charity led by St John's church to provide night shelter for the borough's homeless.

Forest Churches Emergency Night Shelter (FCENS) offers a safe, warm, welcoming and dry place for up to 30 rough sleepers each night from November through March, on a church hall rotation.

In addition, guests receive a hot dinner, breakfast, clothing and cleaning facilities, including showers at some venues.

With around 150 homeless people helped each year, the vital work of the charity couldn't happen without the time, compassion and donations of local people. More than 250 volunteers cook, serve and sit with those who are referred by the local authority or other organisations to the charity for accommodation.

In Leytonstone, three churches provide shelter on a rotation basis: Wesleyan Holiness, Harrow Green; Elim Church, Hainault Road; and Leytonstone United Free Church, Wallwood Road.

As well as volunteers, the charity also needs donations: food, sleeping bags and of course, money.

That's because it employs a fulltime caseworker to help rough sleepers access housing, fill out benefit forms, overcome immigration issues, gain access to healthcare including mental health services, support for substances misuse and alcohol addictions.

Last season, FCENS hosted 134 men and 26 women. Among them, 15 were housed directly into council accommodation, 32 private sector rented housing and 5 into hostels. In addition, 2 were assisted to return to their country of origin, 3 were reconnected to their boroughs of origin and 6 were transferred to other shelters. Chaired by Reverend David Britton, Vicar at St John's, the charity is continually looking for support to help run the project.

willingly give up their time to volunteer. We are constantly amazed, and very grateful, for the support we get from so many members of our community."

The churches first opened their doors to homeless people in 2009 to plug a gap left by the temporary closure of the borough's only hostel for homeless people. It registered as a charity in 2012 and today it's managed by a team of seven committed trustees. On top

of the full-time caseworker, the charity employs a part-time assistant caseworker and two part-time overnight staff.

A week after his 90th birthday, Lister Road legend Ron Allen, led a group of young and old neighbours on a tour of E11 to show us where the bombs fell.



A Leytonstone mixed up choir

Parents have been getting together at the end of school on a Friday and it's nothing to do with the children. Amy Barbour writes why she and a group of Davies Lane parents are hoping to take their singing to the next level.

Singing is a great way to relieve stress and improve your mental health. We've been taking part in a five week singing project under the guidance of *Jeremy Haneman* from *Together Productions*, a London based community interest company that uses the arts and music to effect social change.

When we were invited to take part almost everyone responded with 'I'd love to but I can't sing'. Five hour long sessions later and we are all confidently singing South African, Zulu and African American spiritual songs. And each of us busy exhausted parent's leave the school at 4.30 feeling happier, more confident and joyful.

With a small pot of funding from Waltham Forest as part of the Borough of Culture this was a pilot to develop a **Mixed Up Chorus** in Leytonstone. The **Mixed Up Chorus** is an already existing choir in north London run by *Holly Jones* and *Jeremy Haneman* of *Together Productions* to build community and create positive social change. Their projects connect individuals and organisations who might not otherwise meet, and nurture relationships and understanding, with a particular focus on offering visibility and opportunities to the marginalised – refugees, migrants, religious minorities for example.

The aim of the Mixed Up Chorus (MUC) is to connect diverse people and communities through music. Currently running in north London it has over 60 members. Samim Patel a parent at Davies Lane and long time Leytonstone community member has been working hard to mobilise parents and others to come and sing together. At an evening pilot session this week she managed to organise over 30 people to come along and sing together for the first time.

As you may be aware singing is known to reduce stress, build confidence and self esteem and perhaps most importantly, in these politically divisive times, to bring communities together. We are really hoping to bring the **Mixed Up Chorus** to Leytonstone more permanently. We are currently seeking more funding to set us off and will use a sliding scale subscription for membership. Those who can and are willing to will pay what they can, but this will be voluntary.

We are also really committed to creating a mixed choir so we are inviting you to join, however you identify and we are particularly keen to hear from those who identify as being from black, Asian and minority ethnic (BAME) backgrounds; LGBTQ+; and those with disabilities.

However, you identify please try to ignore the voice in the head that's telling you, you can't sing and come and give it a go, from experience I can promise you singing in a choir with others is a really special joyous thing to do.

Not one but two new and very different fitness centres will open shortly on the High Road. *Andrew Shields* laces up his trainers to find out more

BARA residents with long memories may remember that the site now occupied by the Walnut Tree pub was previously a gym. Not just any old gym, mind you: this was Hyams International Gymnasium, a standout location for London body builders.

The 1989 'Time Out Guide to Sport, Health and Fitness in London' described it as 'a vast centre. The gym, on the first floor, is big enough to train a battalion. It's a family-run business, friendly and down-to-earth'. However, there was also a note of caution: 'The members are mainly men, who apparently intimidate many of the women into quick retreat'.

As the next decade dawned, rave culture found a home at Hyams. All-night warehouse parties included the launch of Phaze Two in October 1992, with DJs, MCs, a laser show and 'sensible security' for 'thousands of ravers'. The flyer for 'Future', a New Year's Eve 1992 party run by Meltdown Productions, even promised coaches running from Kent and included a location map extraordinarily similar to the graphic used by BARA...

As rave declined so did Hyams, and Wetherspoons moved in. The only remaining option for Bushwooders seeking a fitness fix was Cathall Leisure Centre, a bus ride away. The years since have brought a clutch of small personal training studios, the growth of yoga and Pilates classes in various pubs and church halls, the wonderful ParkRun on the Flats, and Radical Fitness for dedicated gym rats — but never a commercial fitness chain.

Now, however, our stretch of the High Road is to benefit from two exciting additions aimed

at everyday exercisers rather than the hardcore muscle crew.

Work is underway to kit out the Fitness Hub East London in what used to be the Radical Fitness premises. The more holistic approach to health and well-being taken here is the brainchild of Dave Appanah and George Lopez, both chartered physiotherapists at the highly regarded Orient Physiotherapy Clinic further down the High Road.

A new year opening is the aim, ideally in time for those well-intentioned resolutions. However, the building refurbishment has taken longer

than expected due to the need for extensive remedial structural work.

The plan is for pay-as-you-go with different package options, as well as memberships, and a programme based around popular studio activities including yoga, Pilates, boxing, Zumba, barre, spinning, HIIT, calisthenics and dance. This will also be the new location for Orient Physio.

"We hope to create a facility that's at the heart of the community – a genuine hub," says George. "A place where you can get your endorphins flowing then enjoy a smoothie and a chat in the relaxation area. It will be an evolv-

ing concept: we will add to the programme as we find out what activities local people want." Following a protracted planning process which saw their original application refused, PureGym will be opening in what is currently the Peacocks store. PureGym is a UK-wide chain with a clear USP: no contracts, no frills, no fluffy towels and very competitive pricing.

According to their business profile on the Best Companies website: 'PureGym offer really great fitness facilities with enthusiastic, supportive staff. They provide 99 per cent of what 99 per cent of the population could possibly want for a truly great workout. Each gym offers over 220 pieces of fitness equipment and up to 80 group exercise classes each week. PureGym's current membership is 450,000, growing by 75 per cent a year.'

Exactly what facilities will be offered at the Leytonstone centre are currently unknown. However, it is likely to be a mix of cardio equipment, fixed and free weights and instructor-led classes, with personal trainers available. There's no opening date yet, nor any indication of cost. The Ilford centre is priced from £14.99 per month while the soon-to-open Romford gym will be from an even leaner £10.99 per month. One feature that has elicited something of a mixed response is the possibility of 24-hour opening – usual practice at other branches of PureGym. Shift workers and night owls will love the chance to work out at 3am, some local residents may be less happy if there's an increase in late-night noise.

Research has shown that one of the biggest barriers to exercising regularly is travel time to a suitable venue. Come 2020, BARA members will have absolutely no excuse – in fact, a brisk walk to PureGym or the Fitness Hub will be the perfect warm-up!

BARA litter pick ends in police drama

A big crowd turned out for Novembers litter pick, discovering everything from stolen goods, thigh length boots, bottles of urine and a bomb. *Katie Smith* reports

On a dull day in November 30 BARA residents and some children ventured onto Bushwood to do the autumn litterpick. It was a great turnout and we cleared a lot of rubbish including an oven and other strange items. We discovered two encampments, one was empty but the other had someone living in it and we made sure that the local council homeless unit were informed to assist them. One resident also returned with a bag of rubbish and announced she thought she had two bombs in her bag. Thankfully one was just a motor but the other looked like an anti-tank shell so the emergency services were contacted and turned up to take care of it. They moved everyone back a safe distance and closed off the nearest



roads. Thankfully it was only a dummy shell. Exciting Sunday morning and the kids certainly enjoyed the excitement. Thanks to all those who helped on the day, another great clean up.





When Ruth Solomons and her fiancé Phil Schryber moved to Bushwood three years ago, the Leytonstone and Wanstead Synagogue (LAWS) was so obscure it wasn't even listed on Google Maps.

Although LAWS has existed since 1932 and has been in its current building on the corner of Fillebrook and Drayton Roads since 1954, the synagogue had fallen into such a state of disrepair that most passers-by assumed that it was derelict.

In 2017 LAWS was on the verge of closing down. With religious services held there infrequently and for an ever declining number of worshippers, it was assumed that there was not a sizeable enough local Jewish community to justify keeping it open.

Enter Ruth and Phil, who sought to make a case to the Federation of Synagogues, the umbrella national organisation to which LAWS is affiliated, that the synagogue should remain open. They began by researching census data that actually showed quite a large number of Jews living within a 30-minute walk and unserved by any other synagogues. In turn, officials at the Federation set a target: that the synagogue should achieve a minyan (a quorum of 10 congregants) for weekly Shabbat (Sabbath) services. Undaunted, the pair sought to find creative ways of reaching out to local Jews,



ranging from establishing an online presence for the synagogue to chatting with shoppers in the kosher foods section of Tesco.

Their efforts brought together a group of volunteers who have helped restore the synagogue. So far, this has involved fixing the leak-

ing roof, plastering walls and painting, with many more repairs still to come.

"One day when our gardening group was outside clearing away years of overgrown shrubs, a woman stopped by and asked why we don't sort out our broken stained glass window," Ruth recalls. Indeed, the hole in the window was the most obvious outward symbol of a neglected building. This inspired the community to launch an online crowdfunding campaign, which ultimately generated the funds needed to hire a local artisan Bryan Paveley from Ark Stained Glass, based in the nearby Norlington Road studios, to make the repair.

The revival of the physical structure has taken place in tandem with a revival in community life as well. Shabbat services are now held weekly; celebrations are organised to mark Jewish festivals; and the Synagogue hosts a range of social and educational events.

In the Jewish tradition, travelling by car, using technology or spending money are forbidden on Shabbat – which presented a particular problem when it came to finding a Rabbi to lead this growing community. Fortunately, Ruth and Phil persuaded Rabbi Zalmy Brackman, who lives in Stamford Hill, to take on the role. For the past two years, Rabbi Brackman has walked the nine miles round trip every weekend to lead services for LAWS worshippers.

This month, LAWS' Chanukah celebrations will form part of Waltham Forest's year as the London Borough of Culture. The synagogue received funding to erect a giant menorah (a ceremonial nine-branched candelabra) at the junction of Grove Green Road and Fillebrook Roads, opposite Leytonstone station. It will be lit for eight nights beginning on 22nd December. On 29th December at 4.00pm, LAWS will host a Chanukah celebration, open to all who wish to attend, alongside this new menorah. There will be traditional Jewish music and the customary Chanukah fried foods such as doughnuts and latkes (potato pancakes).

Bushwood Planning Report

The BARA Committee maintain an overview of planning applications and decisions in the local area including Leytonstone High Road.

The Bushwood Planning Report details recent planning issues which the committee feel are of interest to BARA members. London City Airport

London City Airport's draft master plan 2020-2035 consultation has now closed. The Airport are now considering the feedback and are planning to publish a consultation report and final master plan in the new year. Although BARA did not provide a response to the consultation we are aware that the London Borough of Waltham Forest provided a robust response to the consultation.

Harvey House, Harvey Rd

As BARA have noted in this update previously, this is an application for a proposed nursery. BARA Committee submitted a letter of objection raising concerns about the owner's disregard of planning rules as building continued despite cladding which required additional planning permission. The owner has since apologised to the Planning Committee and to the Chair of the Committee separately.

The Bara Committee also raised concerns about the potential increase in parking at drop-off and pick-up times as these will fall outside of current controlled parking zone hours. We await the decision of the Planning Committee due to be heard on 3rd December.

Pure Gym (site of Peacocks Retail on Leytonstone High Road)

As BARA residents may well be aware, Pure Gym won their appeal and now plan to open a gym on the current Peacocks Retail site.

Rear of 69 Browning Road

This planning application was for the building of two, four bedroom houses consisting of two-storeys at the rear of 69 Browning Road. BARA had previously submitted planning objections to this development. However, the Planning Committee heard a renewed planning application on 12th November. Residents galvanised and showed up in force for the planning meeting. Councillor Loakes and three residents spoke against the application and there were approximately 20 residents in the gallery demonstrating it was a significant issue for residents. Jointly, they successfully convinced the Planning Committee to refuse the application. In summary, on the basis that the proposed development:

- Was out of keeping with the prevailing character of the surrounding area;
- Lacked sufficient information about surface water and flooding as owners were planning to excavate properties to include basements;
- Did not provide adequate evidence that there was suitable access for fire services.



Something sweet, natural and delicious is being made in Bushwood. James Cowen meets the local honey makers.

What started as a bit of fun to tackle a hayfever problem has turned from a hobby into a fledgling business. Salma and Khalil Attan got into the honey business after Khalil had read his hayfever could be helped by eating honey made from the local pollen.

After an introductory course ten years ago the Mornington Road family have continued to grow their hives and are now producing over five hundred jars of their own honey each year.

They have ten hives at their house as well as another thirty at various allotments around the area. Honey production depends on the conditions from year to year and this year has been a good one. A warm summer and lots of flowers make the best conditions and its during these warm months that the bulk of the honey production is done.

Bees fly from flower to flower collecting nec-

tar in their stomachs which is passed to honey making bees when they return to the nest. The honey is stored in wax honeycomb storage cells and capped with beeswax. They can fly up to 3 miles in any direction so if you see bees in your garden, they could be making honey you could buy.

Khalil demonstrated how the honey is extracted. A tool is used to break the seal on the racks of honeycomb which are then loaded in to a centrifuegal drum. The spinning drum spins out the honey and it collects around the drum wall, pours down and is collected from a tap. The honey is then decantered straight in to jars and is ready to eat.

At the moment the honey is not available in any shops and they don't have a website. However, you can still buy it by getting in touch with Salma on 07814 700 974 or dropping round to 79 Mornington and buying a jar. I'm sure they'd love to show you the hives and talk bees. They also sell bees wax blocks which have many uses around the house and can also be melted and made into candles.

Bee keepers have been troubled by a highly aggressive predator that preys on honey bees and pollinators. Originally from Asia and introduced accidentally in France they spread rapidly and have been spotted in the UK since 2016.

They are most likely to be seen near hives in suburban areas in the south of England. It has distinctive markings on its abdomen, almost entirely black with the 4th segment being yellow. If you spot the hornet its important to report it to alertnonnative@ceh.ac.uk You can also download the free app for your phone Asian Hornet Watch. There is a range of honey to choose from and it comes in large or small jars. The medium is £5 and the large is £7. An ounce block of beeswax can be bought for £1.50.

Khalil and Salma, who grew up in Leytonstone, also run a course with Epping Forest Beekeepers that runs throughout the summer. The course fills up quickly and you have to book a year in advance to get a place. It appears urban beekeeping is on the up so if you're interested in getting in to bees - find more details at http://eppingforestbeekeepers.co.uk

School Streets Consultation

BARA have been informed that Waltham Forest Council (WFC) intends to consult with local residents in roads around both Davies Lane and George Tomlinson Primary Schools (many of whom will be BARA Members and parents of children at these schools) early in the New Year on the introduction of 'School Streets'. We thought it would be helpful to give BARA members a heads up of this proposed consultation and some of the context and background.

This consultation is likely to affect BARA members who are parents with children at those schools and who are residents living in roads affected by the proposed changes. We believe that the roads most likely to be consulted on the 'School Streets' proposal within the Bushwood area will be:

Lister Road Michael Road Barclay Road (but to a lesser extent)

Bottom part of Bushwood (from the barrier towards Mornington Rd)

Mornington Road (from Barclay Road down towards Davies Lane School) Other roads including Davies Lane will also be consulted for Davies Lane Primary School and roads around George Tomlinson Primary School.

The consultation is likely to ask residents to consider access to non-local vehicles to those roads to be limited from using those roads at the start and end of the school day with the times tweaked to accommodate the individual schools start and finish time and in operation during term time only and excluding weekends, therefore limited to when the school is open. Residents and business vehicles registered in those roads will not be affected.

What is a 'School Street'

A 'School Street' is an initiative to improve road safety and reduce congestion to make it easier, more convenient and safer for pupils and their parents to walk and cycle to school, rather than drive. It also aims to help improve air quality and help introduce more exercise and regular physical activity into younger residents daily lives, helping address the well documented growing levels of inactivity amongst our children and



young people. School Streets involve temporarily closing one or more roads surrounding a school to non-residents vehicles for a short period at the start and end of the school day, typically one hour, with emergency vehicles being exempt. The enforcement of a 'School Street' is undertaken by CCTV.

Context

Waltham Forest has already installed two School Streets in Leyton, with very positive impacts and a third is planned for Walthamstow. Other London Boroughs are rolling them out and Waltham Forest is currently in

discussion with 20 other schools on the introduction of a School Street. In the era of a Climate Emergency, reducing short distance car journeys for trips like the school run, is one of the easier changes that can be made to help reduce our impact on the environment. Taking unnecessary vehicle movements with their emissions and the associated parking stress out of BARA roads on a daily basis has the potential to improve the living conditions and health and well-being of residents in those roads.
